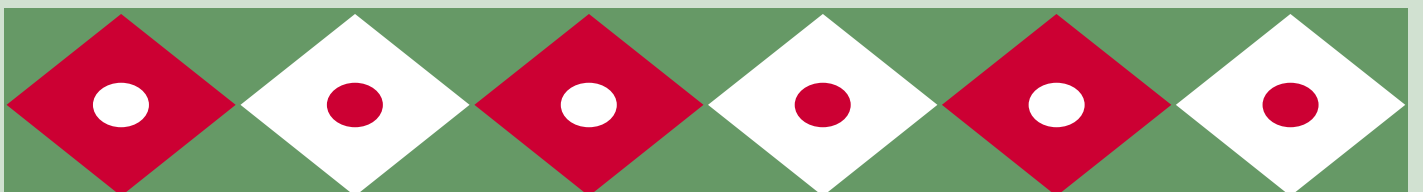

The Worship Ministry has several events coming up in December that you will certainly want to be a part of:

DECEMBER 2ND: The Worship Ministry of Our Savior's has a wonderful opportunity to make a connection with individuals in our community on Friday December 2nd. We will be participating in the 2011 Living Windows Showcase, downtown Jefferson City. For those who may not know, the Living Windows has been a Jefferson City tradition for almost 20 years. Downtown Storefronts and windows come alive with dancers, singers, and religious/holiday themes. Hayrides wind their way through the streets and Santa Claus makes his yearly visit to Hawthorn Bank. This year over 50 groups are participating in the event that will fill High Street from Jefferson Street to Adams Street for more than three blocks of entertainment. The worship ministry has a prime location at the new Spectator's Bar and Grill on the corner of Monroe St. and High St. The praise band will be playing and singing Christmas songs/praise songs to the many people passing by. We will then use this video as an introduction in our upcoming Christmas Eve Service. The Living Windows begins at 6PM and ends around 8PM on Friday Dec. 2nd. Set up will begin around 4:00 PM that evening, Rick (our drummer) is bringing sound equipment and he will need help with that. If you can help, please be there then. Come out and say hello and support Our Savior's on Friday Dec. 2nd.

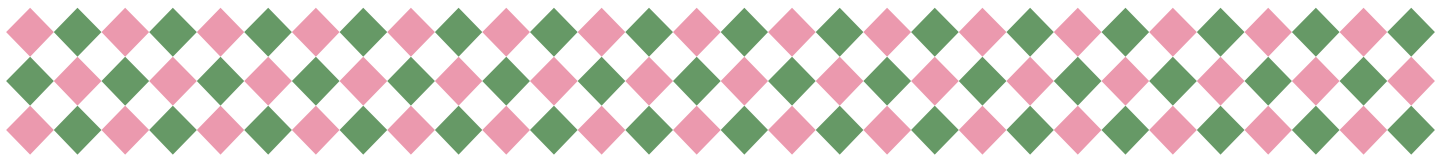

Please make and wear a nametag



The idea of nametags has been discussed before and after the discussions at the CONNECTIONS Team meeting we are going to give it a try! Having pre-printed nametags for members could make guests feel singled out or embarrassed. So, starting Sunday, the 11th of December, just as we ask all members to complete communication cards every week, we are also asking all members to make nametags for themselves every week. If a guest sees members filling out and wearing nametags, the guest will likewise feel comfortable filling one out. Then we will all be able to communicate with each other without feeling embarrassed by not know knowing or remembering names. Those serving in CONNECTIONS Team roles and the Leadership will eventually have special nametags to make them more visible. Nametags and markers will be available at many locations in the building to assure adequate traffic flow. Everyone is encouraged to make a nametag to wear. Remember, we are all either guests or hosts, and either way, it will help others to recognize and communicate with us.

Function and Flow

Why do you come to Our Savior's? Is it for inspiring worship? Is it for fellowship? Is it for being quiet in God's presence? Is it for being in relationship with God and with our community? There are areas in our building for each of these purposes. Let's talk about the purpose of the areas of our building on the lower level.

At the north end of our building we have the Worship Center. Some also call it the Sanctuary and some the auditorium. Whatever you call it, we know it is a space to be in God's presence; a space to glorify God with song and music; a space to hear God's word; and a space for prayer, meditation and reflection. We encourage you to come into this space five to ten minutes before worship begins and take this time to meditate, to prepare for worship and to be quiet in God's presence,

At the south end of our building we have the Fellowship Hall. This is our community space; our gathering space; a place for sitting and chatting; a place for carrying on conversations; and a place to mingle and meet guests in our midst. We are also using a corner of this space for small group discussions at the same time that services are held in the Worship Center. We ask those continuing to have conversations and fellowship during these times to please be aware of how we are sharing this space.

Then we have the space in between. Some call it the Narthex and some call it the lobby. This is a space for going and coming; a space for greeting, directing and saying farewell; and a space for giving out information. We want to encourage movement through this space into the Worship Center or into the Fellowship Hall. Our new Narthex/Lobby is beautiful, but does not absorb sound well. When it is crowded, the volume level is heightened and when it is not crowded, even moderate voice levels can disturb those in worship. Please keep this in mind when coming and going through this space. Indeed, we celebrate that we are experiencing the new people we have prayed for. This is wonderful, but it intensifies the concern over sound levels in this area and it means we need to maximize our room for the movement of people. As a result, the leadership team has decided to remove the pew along the nursery wall. We know that some of our folks have grown accustomed to sitting there. We are asking you to understand that we need to focus on the intended usage of this space, especially as we are now exploring the use of nametags which will require locations for people to sign in. These are the issues that come with the realization of our vision. We thank God for the need to deal with such growing pains.

May God bless your household this Christmas Season!

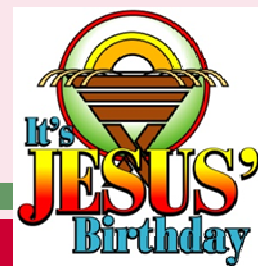

Before that meeting, I intentionally went into prayer to ask God, “What do you want us to do?” and “What are your desires?” I was led to two separate portions of the Bible. Look up Romans 8:12-17 and Galatians 4:1-7. I will say it again—I do not know the Bible well enough to know what those passages of Scripture say; I only know that God spoke to me through those words.

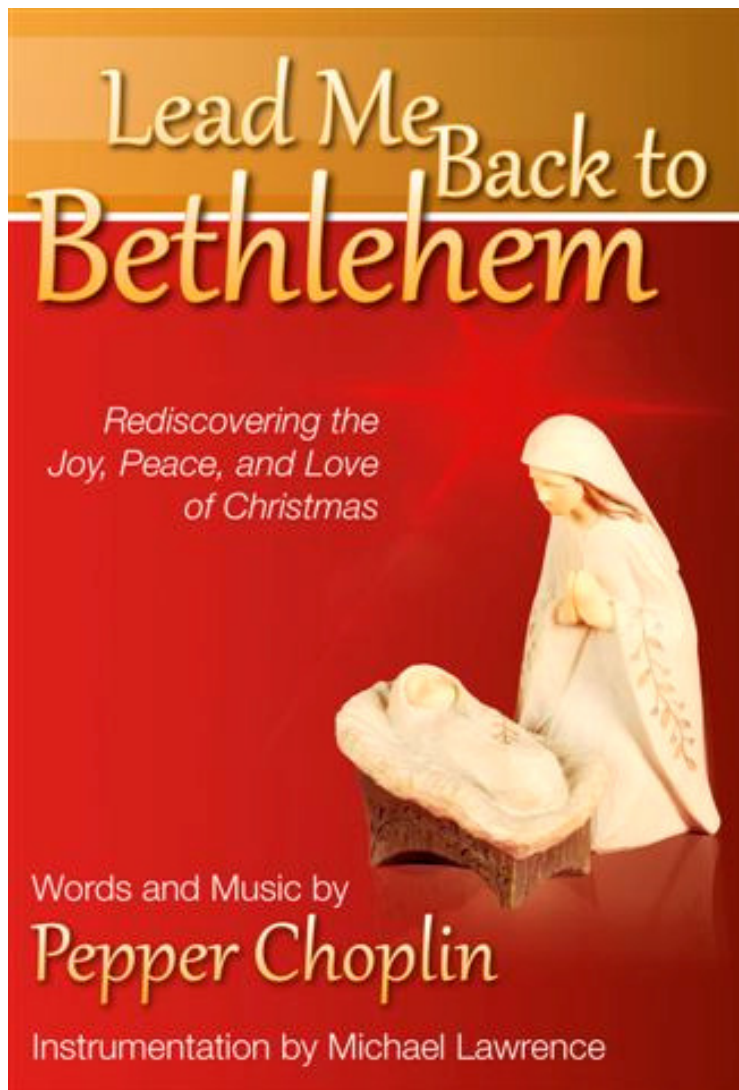
If you read those verses you will see that in both, God tells us that we are no longer slaves, but children of God and heirs of His kingdom. We have the privilege of calling out to Him, “Abba, Father.” I was not sure what God was trying to tell me until later that evening. He was telling us that He is waiting for us to cry out to Him as if we were His children and needing His help. When we were children and we had a need we went to our parents/guardians and said, “Help me.” What did we expect? Was there any doubt in our minds that our parents/guardians would be there for us to give us what we needed? No. Why don't we expect God to do the same for us? Why do we doubt? Because our faith is not strong, because Satan has misled and deceived us, because we are human. There are a multitude of excuses. The truth is that God is gracious beyond our imagination. As I write this I am reading in *The Story* about how the Israelites grumbled and complained about not having meat to eat. God heard their cries and provided so much quail that it was coming out their nostrils! Seriously, how amazing is that?

We need to stop grumbling and complaining about what we don't have and cry out to God, “Abba, Father” (meaning, Daddy, help us!) He is ready, willing and able to give us not just what we need, but more than we can imagine. Our God is awesome, powerful and amazing! Do we believe that with all of our hearts, our minds and our strength? If so, then it is way past time to cry out to Him for help. Abba Father—help us bring glory to You and the Gospel to all the world. Pray with me with a belief that God will give us not just what we need, but what He desires—surpassing our wildest imaginations!!

When it gets toward the end of the calendar year, I have a tendency to look backward on all that has transpired during the previous 12 months. Sometimes this brings me great joy as the year may have been filled with many wonderful moments and other times, well, more challenges than joy were experienced.

In my reading of *The Story* I was intrigued by the relationship of wandering to taking risks. In the story of Moses leading the children of Israel to the land of Canaan, after the 12 spies come back and report on what they had seen, only two of them encouraged the community to go forward. Ten thought it was too risky and advised taking a safe course of action. That decision resulted in God sending the group through the wilderness for another 40 years for not trusting that he would bless them if they followed his guidance.

When I examine the decisions I have made and how often I have taken the 'wait and see' approach or stayed put doing the 'safe' thing, I wonder whether I have missed blessings that might have come had I been in better tune with God's plan for me. Was I wandering when I could have been getting more directly to where God wanted me to be? I can't help but imagine that this may be true.

In looking back over this past year at Our Savior's I see our moving through the decision to take a risk on doing a renovation that we believed was consistent with what God was asking us to do in preparing our physical building to support our mission. I would agree that it was big and scary and the future was uncertain. Add to that some people leaving our community for a variety of reasons and you have a recipe for concern and questioning. Was all this a leap of faith or an unacceptable risk with serious consequences?

I have to believe that there are times when God's intent for us is not exactly crystal clear. I think that's the faith piece, when we have to trust that he has only our best interests in mind and wants to bless us when we do as he asks. Our job is to stay focused on what he has asked us to do, the mission per se, pray for guidance and then trust him. We are skilled at over analyzing, playing out all the negative consequences and taking a wait and see approach. Is that what God asks us to do? Certainly he expects us to seek his counsel and act wisely, which is what I believe we have done. The most challenging aspect is keeping our eyes focused on him and not wavering. As long as we stay in line with God's mission, we will be blessed and our wandering will be over.

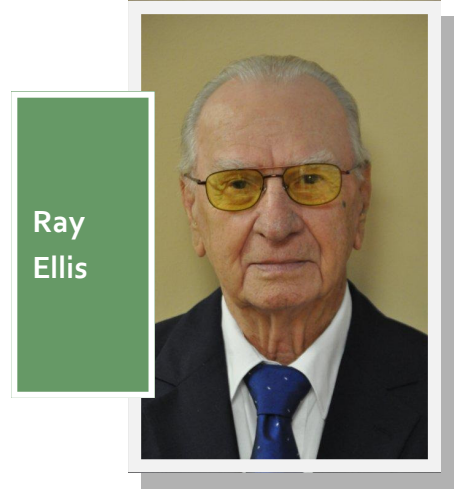
